Dear Parents

It's time for me to reflect on the term and remind you of the highlights. At first, everything seemed normal. It was a fantastic occasion and we were overjoyed to see the Junior Choir win the Under 8s and the Senior Choir come 3rd in the Under 11s categories. Well done children and the Music Department!

World Book Day was a great success and everyone enjoyed dressing up as their

favourite book character and browsing through the book fair. The teachers held a series of English and SATs workshops for the parents, which were well-attended and very informative.

Suddenly, everything changed, the school closed to all but a few critical workers' children, the world became surreal and we moved into a new phase of school life where the learning has all been done remotely. The teachers have been working round the clock to make the online learning successful and effective in meeting the children's learning needs. I know that many of our children have loved the online activities and embraced the technology. 
Dudley Music Festival
